stallion Huston is seen in parades throughout California toting a stunning pink and silver Swarovski rhinestone saddle created for Sylvester Stallone by Nudie, designer to the stars. Cici's Sir Keith, a St. Clarins son, will stand in 2009. Sir Keith is unique in that he carries not just the silver gene of his sire but also the cream gene of his dam, making him the only smoky black silver dapple stallion standing in the United States at this time. The stallion, Cici's Sir Collin, is a lovely traditional-type tobiano buckskin stallion expecting five foals in 2009 and is being

offered for sale. He will stand until sold at Cielo Celeste Farm. Cici's Duke of Earl, a sensational buckskin out of a palomino dam, completes the rainbow of unique and rare colors of the Gypsy stallion band available at Cielo Celeste Farm.

In order to fully appreciate who Celeste is, a quick visit to her celebrities and friends page on her website would be a telling experience. You will then realize that this woman has had years of experience in the horse world as well as an exciting life. In the late 1950s, Celeste was studying with her first dressage master, Herr Albert Ostermeyer, in the classic style of the Spanish Riding School of Vienna.

Also studying with Albert at the time was Dianne Olds Rossi, an icon in her own right, who will be performing her exciting dancing horses act at the 2009 Renaissance Gypsy Affaire held at Cielo Celeste Farm on August 1 and 2, 2009. Dianne's involvement in the horse industry is wide and varied and has included Arabian, Andalusian, Lipizzan and Friesian horses. She has the ability to make a love of horses come alive for all those who witness her perfor-

mance. The magic and motion of the horses draws spectators into the act. Celeste and Dianne had a wonderful foundation in dressage from Herr Albert and feel part of this wonderful event is dedicated to his memory.
